Calm, cool, and collected, San Francisco-based designer Brittany Haines' interiors encourage respite. With neutral nods to midcentury and unique artisanal touches, her interiors feel curated, crisp, and thoroughly livable. "Approaching design through all of the senses creates spaces that encourage the natural urge to linger," Haines says.



Edel Legaspi

We were introduced to Edel Legaspi when shown a Tudor transformation she infused with an updated take on traditional—and a little attitude. (You'll see it in a 2019 issue.) Having studied under Kelly Wearstler, Legaspi has honed the balance of color and texture and a respect for architecture that we know will take her places.
